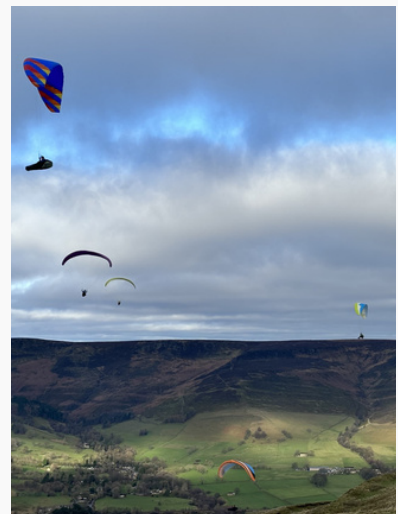
## STAFF NEW YEAR'S GREAT RIDGE PEAK DISTRICT TREK - JOIN IN

*A report from Mr Wilkinson about the Great Ridge Peak District Trek.*

As part of the Geography Department's outreach programme and contribution to SEC health and wellbeing the SEC Mountaineering Society enjoyed its inaugural trek on Friday 5 January 2024.

An enthusiastic group of colleagues traversed the Great Ridge above Castleton in the Peak District summitting Mam Tor. The walk lived up to its name and included a great ridge, a road destroyed by a 4000 year old landslide (that's still sliding!) in the 1970's and a spectacular ancient coral reef over 300 million years old!

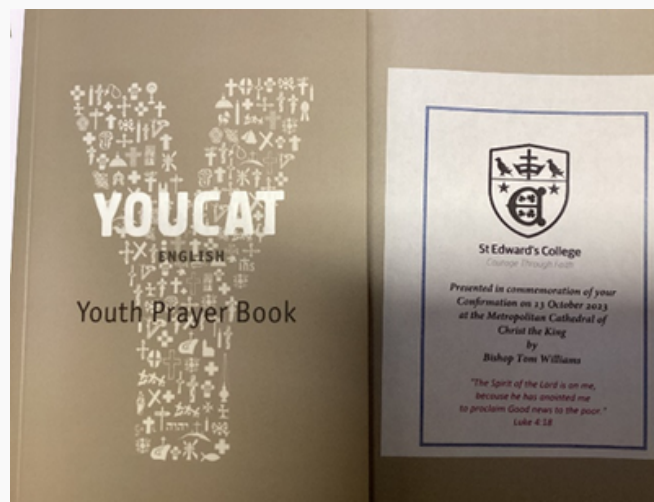

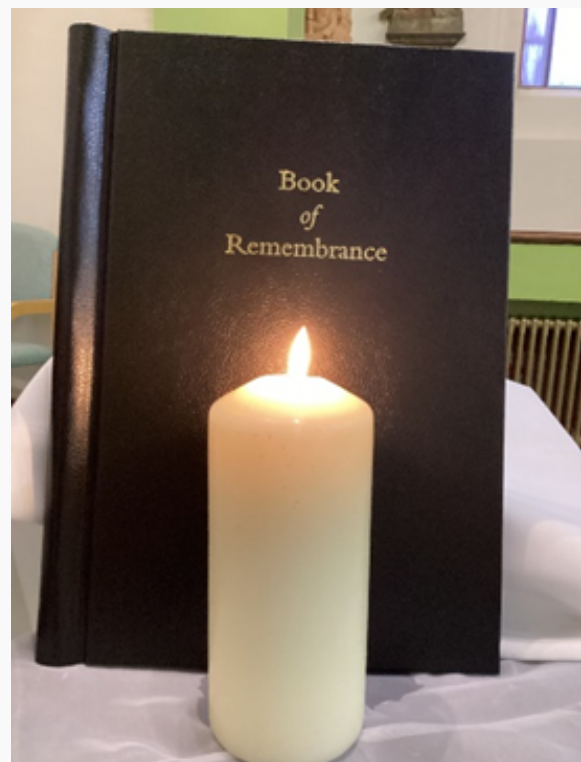
## **Confirmation Presentation**

Pupils will learn about Sexual intercourse as more than just a physical act, but a gift from God for married couples, an expression of love and his plan for how children are made. Pupils will explore self-esteem and reflect on different types of friendship and family structure, with consideration of thoughts, feelings and actions. Our RSE programme does not set out to tell pupils what to think or do; we respect their autonomy. But it does seek to provoke thought, personal reflection, and to help them understand the wisdom of the Church's teaching and how they might choose to learn from that rich tradition.

<b>Year 8</b>	Pupils will appreciate male/female differences and learn about rooting our identity in who God created us to be. Our RSE programme does not set out to tell pupils what to think or do; we respect their autonomy. But it does seek to provoke thought, personal reflection, and to help them understand the wisdom of the Church's teaching and how they might choose to learn from that rich tradition.

But it does seek to provoke thought, personal reflection, and to help them understand the wisdom of the

There will also be a Careers Breakfast talk Monday 29 January 8am with **EasyJet**. It is open to all year groups who wish to attend.

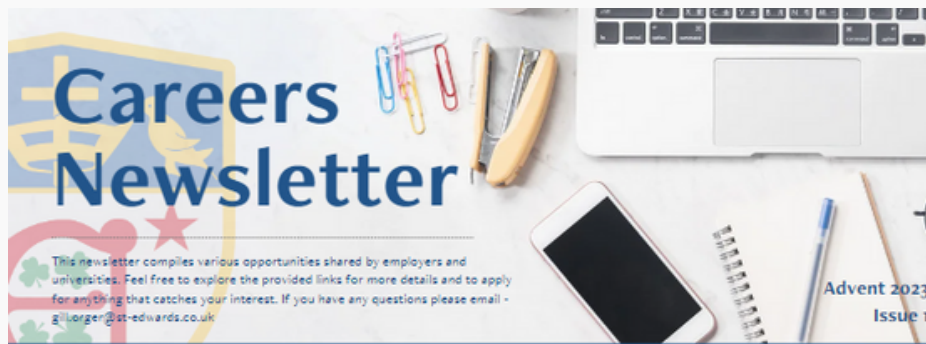
