OXFORD UNION SCHOOLS DEBATING NATIONAL FINALS - BE PROUD

On Saturday 9 March Sixth Form students, Sneha J and Grace S took part in the Oxford Union Schools Debating National Finals in Oxford.

Having qualified through a regional round in Manchester, they joined the best 120 teams from over 1000 schools who had entered from many countries, making it the largest debating competition in the world. Up against far more experienced teams from primarily fee-paying schools all over the globe, they coped brilliantly with the pressure of an intense, exhausting day. The debating motions were highly varied, including, "This house regrets the glorification of the longevity of the careers of sporting superstars such as LeBron James, Cristiano Ronaldo and Tom Brady" and, "This house believes parents should not teach their children about their views on the afterlife".

Grace and Sneha took part in four debates with only a break of about 30 minutes in between each, working together as team in a highly competitive environment. Despite securing an impressive second place in one of those four debates, they did not make it through to the evening's semi-final debate. Having only begun debating in October, Sneha and Grace have made a great impression and done the school proud. Many thanks to Miss Digney for her support with debating and the Politics Society, and to all the other St Edward's debaters, who have created such a positive debating environment, within which all of them have improved so much.
