



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Year 12 students Michael D and Sneha U were invited down to Cambridge Corpus Christi to celebrate the end of the Pelican Programme, only a few select students were invited to this event. Sneha and Michael talk about the opportunity...

In January, I received a place on the Cambridge Corpus Christi Pelican Programme for the Law stream. I entered by working through a legal scenario exploring criminal liability and submitting a summary of my conclusions. Upon success, I was allocated to a group of 6 and a recent law graduate who would lead the fortnightly sessions on various law sectors. There were challenging questions designed for discussion, and everyone would share their thoughts and opinions, and we would receive feedback from the leader of the sessions. It was essential for developing my oracy skills, defending my arguments, and completing long university-style readings.

As we approach the final few weeks of the programme, those who showed the most engagement and commitment to the programme, maximising the resources provided and demonstrating their arguments proficiently, were invited to the end of the Cambridge Pelican Programme celebration. I am very glad to have been selected, and I feel I have learnt so much from these sessions. I can't wait to have the opportunity to meet subject specialists and tutors for tutorial-like sessions during my onenight stay at Corpus Christi College, University of Cambridge. - Sneha I'm currently doing English in the Pelican Programme, and it has been an experience of stimulating depth. We have so far studied a tragic play - 'A Woman Killed with Kindness', an early 17th century tragedy revolving the declining aristocracy, and an Evelyn Waugh novel - 'Vile Bodies' detailing post-war zeitgeist among the 'Bright Young Things' of Mayfair, London, and we will soon begin a poetry anthology, compiled by each member of the programme submitting any poem, which was not by a dead white male, in an effort to encourage diversity. I personally chose Untitled by James Baldwin. In each session, occurring fortnightly, there has been an air of originality and complete freedom of discussion, thanks to the absence of a set curriculum. My mentor, Niaomi, encourages us to push beyond our boundaries of thought and ultimately leads us to think more critically. Overall, this programme has developed my critical thinking skills and enhanced my desire to read wider and more, offering an idea of University pedagogy and independence. - Michael




YEAR 11 SHIRT SIGNING AND COLOURS AWARDS -BE PROUD, WORK HARD
