Formal Dress Code

Why do we have a dress code?

Our Sixth Form students represent the best of all it means to be an Edwardian. Our Formal Dress Code enables them to be role models for younger pupils through smart, professional appearance, whilst also demonstrating their new status as fellow adults within the St Edward's College community.

Boys

A smart, dark-coloured, formal two- or three-piece suit, worn with a formal shirt and the St Edward's College Sixth Form tie. A dark-coloured jumper or waistcoat may be worn in addition to (but not instead of) your suit jacket.

Shoes must be formal, polishable and dark in colour. No trainers.

Boys must be clean shaven* and long hair must be tied back.

Girls

A smart, dark-coloured, formal two- or three-piece suit (trouser suit or skirt suit), worn with an appropriately modest top. Skirts must be knee-length and straight/pencil skirts. A dark-coloured jumper or waistcoat may be worn in addition to (but not instead of) your suit jacket.

Shoes must be formal, polishable and dark in colour. No trainers and no stiletto heels.

Coats

Coats must be removed for all assemblies, tutorials and lessons, in the Refectory and in both the LRC and the Sixth Form LRC.

Students who do not adhere to the above will be sent home to change or amend their appearance and then return to College and will not be admitted to lessons until they have done so. The final decision as to the suitable appearance of Sixth Form students rests with the Sixth Form Leadership Team.



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
