FOSTERING INDEPENDENCE

The Sixth Form at St Edward's offers a broad and stimulating environment in which to spend the final years at school and to prepare for life beyond. We aim to make a positive difference to the lives of our students by inspiring a lifelong love of learning. This begins in Year 7 at St Edward's but is fully realised in the Sixth Form with our Independent Study Programme.

The strength, experience and expertise of teachers who have a passion for their subject along with the skill, enthusiasm and care to work with students to maximise their grades is a key aspect of the St Edward's tradition. Our very positive track record of results, in both raw and added value terms, inspires confidence. The needs of students are always centre-stage. Put simply, young people make clear progress and emerge with results which are the best they could have achieved.

By providing structure and support, we encourage independence and responsibility for learning to grow during these important years of education.





















SCHOLARSHIP

Our Sixth Form students benefit from the wisdom, guidance and advice from experts within the Sixth Form team. One- to-one meetings, interview preparation, lectures and visits to and from Russell Group universities help to guide students on the challenging path towards higher education.

The school's curriculum and daily lessons naturally contribute enormously to the development of scholarship in our pupils, students and staff more than anything else. However, we are fortunate to have a dedicated Sixth Form team whose purpose is to help our students develop the super-curricular skills and interests to make them stand out from the crowd.

Established in 2017, the Honours Programme targets those students who achieved seven or more GCSEs at grade seven or higher and who should, therefore, be considering applying to the most selective and competitive university courses.

It includes aspiration-raising visits to Russell Group universities (Oxford, Cambridge, Durham, York and selected London universities), talks, small group and one-to-one work on developing the super-curricular interests which over-subscribed courses expect, personal statement and application advice, and tailored preparation for university entrance tests and interviews.

All Sixth Form students are encouraged to undertake the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) alongside their studies. The EPQ is notionally worth half an A Level but the true value to participants is in their development as scholars. Completed of their own volition and in collaboration with staff in their specialist areas, these projects represent the finest example of super-curricular scholarship at St Edward's.



PASTORAL

At St Edward's, we pride ourselves on the quality of our pastoral care with the knowledge that each student feels recognised and valued within our community. All members of staff see it as their primary duty to ensure pupils and students at the College feel safe and happy.

Each student receives a personal tutor, who is an A Level or BTEC subject teacher, with the intention they will remain with them throughout their time in the Sixth Form. Personalised pastoral care is the foundation stone of our success; we aim for students to not just be happy but to be fulfilled and have a sense of their own identity and self-worth.

Each student is asked to review their progress, both academically and pastorally, in a bespoke Personal Development Plan. This will allow each student to think individually about what they wish to achieve, in and out of the classroom, and how we can help support them to realise their dreams.

Whilst encouraging independent learning we nurture and provide our students with the tools to feel secure in their learning environment.



















COMMUNITY

There is a strong sense of community at St Edward's; one that offers pupils, students and their families a supportive, happy and caring environment which allows our students to become confident and engaging young men and women.

Underpinning our St Edward's community is the House System; all students join one of six Houses and wear their badge with pride, taking part in and leading House competitions and events. Our Sixth Form students play an active part in the school, offering help to younger pupils in various academic and extra-curricular clubs and developing relationships across all years of the school thanks to House competitions and whole-school events.

Service, Music and Sport are the three main cornerstones of the St Edward's community. There are many volunteering and fundraising opportunities as part of Sixth Form or within Houses to ensure our students understand the importance and value of service.

AWAY FROM THE CLASSROOM




